Scripture References: Genesis 12:1-4, Hebrews 11:8-16, Habakkuk 3:19, Hebrews 12:1

A LAID-DOWN LIFE

Genesis 12:4

- True surrender is being willing to say “yes” to God’s will, even when it challenges one's plans.
- Keep the altar of surrender close to your heart and the path to it straightforward.

Reflection: “God already knows my needs. I focus on asking for His will.”

A MENTALITY OF MOBILITY

Hebrews 11:13

- Be forward-thinking, not stuck in the past. Faith allows us to see God’s promises and take bold steps toward them.
- Shake up your assumptions—sometimes, you must disrupt yourself to be ready for what’s next.

FAITH AS A LIFESTYLE

Hebrews 11:6

Faith fuels every pivot. Trust God to provide in the transition, as He did for Elijah with ravens and Peter with a repositioned net.

PREPARATION

Proverbs 21:31



- Strengthen not just your physical abilities but also your spiritual readiness.
- Be adaptable and aware of what you can leverage for the pivot ahead.
- Stay hungry for growth and opportunity.

THE DISCIPLINE OF AWARENESS

Psalm 46:10

- Slow down to perceive God's micro-shifts in your life.
- These minor adjustments can lead to divine intersections of growth and opportunity.

CURIOSITY

Proverbs 25:2

- Cultivate a learner's mindset—explore new ideas, relationships, and skills.
- God often uses new exposures to prepare you for future pivots.

KEEPING THE LOAD LIGHT

Hebrews 12:1

- Let go of the heavy baggage—past mistakes, guilt, or unforgiveness—that weighs you down.

Like a ship anchored in place, you can't move forward until you release what's holding you back.
